#### Latest Kitty Hawk Shipwreck

On Memorial Day this boat washed up on the Kitty Hawk beach near Maynard St. The ocean was rough the few days before it came ashore. It's anyone's guess how it ended up in Kitty Hawk but likely it was being pulled north behind a sailboat. Spring is the time of year when you occasionally see



sailboats migrating north. A little Internet research showed that maritime law entitles whoever recovers a vessel lost at sea to financial compensation equal to the value of the property. Before the end of the day a neighbor moved this boat to the sound side of the dune line.

During the industrial revolution many farmers' sons went to the city to work. Most never returned to the farm for work. Are people permanently fleeing more urban areas? This is a big question that I don't believe I am qualified to answer. Some economists believe that high speed Internet, remote education, remote medicine and cyber ordering are here to stay. All these trends improve the quality of life for Outer Bankers. However, there are some trade offs. Traffic has become more of a concern for long-time Outer Bankers. Also vacation rental cottages have become more prevalent in some primary residential neighborhoods. People in just about every local industry love our guests; just not at midnight when they are partying in the pool next door.

As of this writing the inventory of property for sale has edged up past 1100 properties. This is the first time since March that it has been that high. A common practice of sellers today is to "shoot for the moon" with their price. If it does not sell quickly then they reduce the price until it finds the market. There are still many buyers looking to own here. They just don't want to be taken advantage of. That reminds me of one thing that stays the same here regardless of the market. ### Kitty Hawk Trails

The town of Kitty Hawk and the state of North Carolina own somewhere around 1000 acres of land in Kitty Hawk. Quite a bit of the property is wetlands and stays wet the entire year. However, there are numerous high ridges of maritime forest that run through this property. Most of these ridges run north to south. You can find trails in this land that locals have been using for years and years. Some are maintained and others are not. The town of Kitty Hawk just finished building a walkway over some wetlands so the public will have easy access to about 460 acres of this coastal reserve. A rarely used trail runs through the middle of this land from the Kitty Hawk Park on Kitty Hawk Road to Kitty Hawk Estates. That's about a two-mile trail. Once the
