OBX Real Estate Market Update

The Outer Banks continues to be a highly desirable place to live, work and vacation. The listing inventory is still significantly lower than it was prior to the pandemic



and there are still many folks looking to purchase here. Interest rates and some other factors have changed the way buyers are buying today. They are much more price sensitive than they were in February of 2023. On the other hand, don't be surprised if a well-priced property quickly receives multiple offers. Historically speaking, our resort market is best for sellers in the spring. If we are going to have appreciation this year then the next few months are likely to be when it happens. There are not many Internet service choices on Outer Banks. Internet speeds vary but it is commonly known that fiber Internet services are generally faster than cable, satellite or DSL. Up until recently,

Spectrum has had the fastest non-commercial Internet service on the beach. That speed is around 1000 Mbps (millibytes per second) for the most expensive service. Continued on page 2.

Switch to Fiber Continued

At a local Kitty Hawk residence 1000 Mbps from Ripple fiber was \$85 a month. Spectrum offered the same speed at this residence for about \$30 more. If you are looking for the fastest and least expensive service, then you may want to consider fiber.



There's been quite a bit of talk recently about rising Outer Banks homeowners' insurance rates. The North Carolina Rate Bureau, made up of insurance companies, makes a request when they think it is necessary. That increase is reviewed by the NC Insurance Commissioner. He is responsible for approving rate increases. In the past, the Insurance Commissioner usually negotiated

down the rate increase. As of this writing, he has rejected the requested rate increases. Since this is an elected position and this year is an election year, it will be interesting to see where our homeowner insurance rates end up.



This provides almost unlimited opportunities for enjoying outdoor activities here. The ground level here is close to 30 feet so
